10. Somersham Strategic Plan

Somersham's Strategic Plan was circulated to all governors.

Ofsted's feedback was: this is a very comprehensive long term plan and will need to work on a more focussed version.

The EHT informed governors it is RAG rated – Green points have been actioned, Yellow points are in progress and Red points still require action. This is to help identify priorities.

This was based on the previous governance model. On review of the strategic plan this will be updated to include that Somersham has joined the Federation and a new GB is in place and will show the impact of the GB.

Challenge: A governor asked the date of the document and that many of the dates have passed.

The EHT stated it was September 2016 but will be updated following the HMI visit. The Strategic Plan will be constantly reviewed and updated. As it is updated it will be sent to Keith Grimwade.

A governor asked if the LINK governors will be included in the Strategic Plan.

The EHT replied a column will be added as the strategic plan is reviewed.

The Chair requested agreement from governors for this to be sent to Keith Grimwade. **All Agreed.**

11. Somersham HMI visit

Somersham had an Ofsted Section 8 visit on 12th October 2016. The last inspection was a Section 5 inspection in March 2015.

BS, VF and **MS** were available to see the inspector from the GB. The inspector commented that she was confident that the Governors have the skills and ability to move Somersham forward and have a proven track record to improve the outcomes for the children.

The EHT shared the report received, highlighting the following points:

- Senior Leadership Team have taken effective action to make further improvement and are addressing the unevenness of teaching. The inspector acknowledged the mixed leadership the school has experienced over the last year but swift action has been taken in the right order. It was noted that YR –Y6 are keen and ready to learn. There is a new assessment strategy, teaching and learning is improving rapidly with staff receiving feedback. The EYFS have received support from the Federation that has had an impact.
- Somersham has benefitted from external support from the LA and the Federation.
- The new GB have the skills to move the school forward rapidly.

The EHT reported that Linda Kilman, the inspector left her contact details and will return in the summer term to review the progress. She has also offered to review the strategic plan and offer advice. The inspector felt that Somersham would benefit from a later visit and will recommend that this will be scheduled for 30 months instead of 24 months.

MS commented that he found the inspector to be very supportive of the work in progress and wanted us to succeed.

VF commented that it was a very fair assessment and the inspector recognised the work that the Federation had put in.

The Chair reminded governors that this is currently confidential until the report is in the public domain.

The GB thanked **BF** and **ML** for the rapid improvements at Somersham as shown by the HMI visit.

The EHT thanked **CM** and **ES** for releasing staff from the Federation to support Somersham.

The Chair received a letter from Tim Coulson re the warning notice issued to Somersham from the LA, this had been circulated to all governors. The Chair shared his response with the governors.

12. The Headteacher's Report

The EHT has met with all HofS's and there are strategic plans in place for each school. There have been questions raised at each school based on the results from summer 2016. Lots of schools have seen dips in data this year but need to maintain the Ofsted judgements of Outstanding and Good.

Holywell - The EHT has requested a visit from the Ely diocese to inspect Holywell to check the standards within school. Holywell will be due their Ofsted inspection approximately the same time as Somersham. The last inspection was in 2013 that was before the new curriculum and changes to the assessment.

St Helen's – have similar issues as Somersham and have priorities on their strategic plan.

The whole of the Federation has benefitted from training sessions from the LA in raising standards in writing.

The EHT informed governors that two training days have been brought forward to the beginning of the Spring term. This is to have three professional days to have a cluster day, receive some writing training from Karen Stanley (teachers and TA's will attend).

Somersham - There are 2 vacancies, Yr 3 and Yr 5

St Helen's – There is 1 teacher and 1 TA on long term sick.

The EHT stated that there is difficulty recruiting teachers nationwide and she attended a Uteach recruitment day. She offered three candidates a position, none of them accepted. This is not a viable way forward for recruitment. She suggested that investing in existing staff may be better for example HLTA applying for the new route into teaching.

A governor suggested appointing a fte teacher to work across all three schools to provide cover.

Challenge: A governor asked what impact the small reception class of 17 at St H's will have.

The EHT replied that St H's budget is in a critical position and will face a £17,000 deficit next year and therefore a 6 class structure must be considered.

A governor asked if children could move from one school within the federation to another to address the unevenness of numbers. This would be a parental choice.

Incidents to report:

- There was an incident outside Holywell school: a pre school child was hit by a car. The car was moving very slowly and the child had run out from between two parked cars. The child is ok. However the wife of the driver is concerned about the volume of parking in Harris Crescent. The GB had objected to the parking restrictions outside the school but did support the 20mph speed limit.

Information re parking at Millfields is regularly sent out in the newsletter, there will be a Road Safety Week at school to emphasise road safety to the children. Children are the responsibility of their parents outside the school gate.

A governor suggested applying again for a footpath to be installed from Millfields to Holywell school to encourage more families to park at Millfields.

The EHT will contact Rosemary Mullen to discuss. **ACTION BF**

15. The Chair's Report

The Chair informed governors there had been 3 applications for the position of Somersham's Head of School. Following short listing 2 candidates will be interviewed on 10th and 11th November.

Interview panel consists of: **BF, BS, EF, VF** and Ann Housden (LA).

ML will end his secondment at the end of Autumn term.
